#### 7/7/16 Planning Applications to be considered:

P16/V0918/SCR Screening Opinion – Development Work

Land to North of A420 & East of Fernham Gate,

Faringdon

For: Taylor Wimpey Oxfordshire

The committee noted with concern that this screening application had already been considered by the District Council and that it had taken the decision that no screening was necessary, despite no input having been received from the Town Council.

It was NOTED there were many inaccuracies in the EIA Analysis & Screening Proforma completed by the District Council which indicated that no research had been carried out, primarily with regard to Q17, Q18, Q23 & Q27. It was AGREED that these inaccuracies should be highlighted and submitted as Town Council's response to the District Council, also expressing Town Council's concern that its views had not been taken into account before a decision had been made by District Council.

It was NOTED that Town Council had received an invitation to attend a public exhibition being held on Thursday, 19 May by Taylor Wimpey on this proposal.

P16/V0869/FUL

Proposed development of 10 flats and an office building, with associated parking and landscaping Land at Park Road, Faringdon

Following lengthy discussion it was AGREED that Town Council should **STRONGLY OBJECT** on the following basis:

- It is contrary to Faringdon Neighbourhood Plan Section 4.5, Objectives;
- It is contrary to Faringdon Neighbourhood Plan Policy
   4.5A, Existing Employment Sites;
- Inaccuracies in Paras 39, 12, & 25 of the Planning,
   Design and Access Statement, these inaccuracies to be detailed to the District Council;
- Inaccuracies in both the URS 2008 and 2013 reports, these inaccuracies to be detailed to the District Council;

It was FURTHER AGREED that Town Council fully supported the objections which were due to be submitted by the Faringdon Chamber of Commerce to the District Council.

#### 8/7/16 Civil Parking Enforcement, Faringdon

Concerns regarding the lack of civil parking enforcement had been raised by members of the public at the recent Town Meeting and subsequently a number of questions had been submitted by a local resident to the Town Council for discussion. These primarily asked what Town Council's assessment was of the scale and impact of the problem of illegal parking in Faringdon, what Town Council's policy was, if any, regarding illegal parking and did the Town Council have any future action plans with respect to illegal parking in the town.

A lengthy discussion then took place.

#### It was NOTED that

- in order to ensure enforcement of yellow lines (double or single), appropriate signage should be in place detailing times that parking can/cannot take place. Some of these had not been erected in Faringdon and it was agreed that Oxfordshire Highways should be asked to remedy this immediately;
- the car parking situation in Faringdon was not good and once the proposed extra 1100 houses for Faringdon had been built, this problem would be exacerbated;
- not only local residents but also visitors would be put off shopping in the town due to the parking problem. This would have a detrimental impact on Faringdon's economy;
- although a parking survey commissioned by the District Council had recently been approved, it was not being observed;
- District Council had formed the opinion that as a survey of residents did not see parking as a problem in Abingdon or Wantage and as there were only a few streets in Faringdon that suffered from inconsiderate parking, to change the system in order to enforce against a minority would cost the taxpayer more. District Council therefore did not see the financial viability of such a scheme;

- District Council had allocated £50k in its budget to fund a study to identify ways to increase car parking capacity across the district, with an initial commitment of up to £2m of capital funding. It was believed this study would be carried out this year;
- enforcement by the local police was inconsistent; more consistency was required.

It was AGREED that Town Council's next step would be to write to the newly elected Police & Crime Commissioner, with a copy to D/Cllr Matt Barber, highlighting the above issues and asking him to look into the matter, applying pressure where required on the relevant local authority in order that the local authority operated a parking policy.

A local resident reiterated his view that Town Council should focus on this issue on behalf of the community, even if the responsibility for civil parking enforcement and parking in general lay with other local authorities.

## 9/7/16 OxLEP Public Consultation – Oxfordshire Strategic Economic Plan (SEP) The concerns of the organisation, *Need not Greed Oxon*, a campaign for a

different future of Oxfordshire than that put forward by the Local Enterprise Partnership, were received and considered. As these dealt with economic issues, committee felt it was more appropriate that Town Council responded to this organisation.

#### 10/7/16 Faringdon Neighbourhood Plan (FNP)

There had been no further news regarding the Independent Examiner's report and when it might be expected. District Council had advised that a new Senior Planner in the Vale Policy Team had been appointed to lead neighbourhood planning generally.

A draft letter which had been drawn up to send to the Secretary of State regarding Town Council's concerns in respect of neighbourhood planning in general was considered. Authority was delegated to the Chairman and the Deputy Town Clerk to finalise the letter to send to the Secretary of State.

#### 11/7/16 S106

Planning Application P15/V0394/O, Land at 4&20, Faringdon: Committee was asked to consider forming a Working Party to progress the use of the development funds outlined in the signed S106 agreement with the District Council in respect of this development.

It was AGREED, however, that as these contributions related to the economic development of Faringdon town as a whole, recommendation should be made to Town Council that it forms the working party.
