MB informed members that the Chamber of Commerce would cease in the next few months.

MB enquired about the Saturday Market. It was explained that volunteers had decided the Market was not viable due to the many permissions and insurances that were required to operate a market in a public space.

MS explained that a Pop Up Business School was being planned in Faringdon in 2019. The school would be free to attend and would teach delegates how to start a new business. The school cost approx. £12,000 and would be funded primarily by VWHDC but other sponsors were needed. MB invited MS to write to the Chamber to ask for support from remaining funds.
