Scheme.

CHARITY COMMISSION.

In the matter of the Charity known as the RECREATION GROUND, in the Parish of GREAT FARINGDON, in the County of BERKS, comprised in a conveyance dated the 25th June 1901; and

In the matter of the Charitable Trusts Acts, 1853 to 1939.

The Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales,
upon an application made to them on the 8th July 1949, in writing, by the Parish Council of Great Faringdon under the hands of

And it appearing that the said council are the Trustees of the above-mentioned Charity :

And after due notice of the intention to make this Order published according to the direction of the Board by being affixed to or near a principal outer door of the Parish Church of Faringdon and of the Corn Exchange, Faringdon, on the 21st October 1949 and by advertisement in the newspaper called the North Wilts Herald and Advertiser on the 28th October 1949 (being in each case more than one calendar month before the date hereof) :

And having received no notice of any objection to the proposed Order or suggestion for the variation thereof :

And after due communication of the draft of the subjoined Scheme to the said council :

Do hereby Order as follows :—

The subjoined Scheme is approved and established as the Scheme for the regulation of the Charity.

SCHEME.

1. *Administration of Charity.*—The above-mentioned Charity and the endowment thereof consisting of the property specified in the first schedule hereto and all other the endowments (if any) of the Charity shall be administered and managed subject to and in conformity with the provisions of this Scheme by the Trustees of the Charity namely by the Parish Council of Great Faringdon.

2. *Sale.*—The Trustees may sell the said property for not less than £1,000 and may do and execute all proper acts and assurances for carrying the sale into effect subject to the condition that all the costs, charges and expenses attending or incidental to the sale including the costs of the deduction and verification of any title which may be required to be shown to the said property shall be paid by the purchaser.

3. *Title of Charity.*—After such sale as aforesaid the Charity shall be called the George Liddiard Recreation Ground Fund.

4. *Authority for expenditure.*—The Trustees may appropriate and expend out of the clear proceeds of the sale a sum not exceeding one equal half part thereof in defraying the cost of laying out and improving the recreation ground at Great Faringdon more particularly specified in the second schedule hereto.

5. *Replacement.*—The sum expended as aforesaid shall be replaced out of the income of the Charity in manner following. The Trustees shall pay the unexpended balance of the said clear proceeds of sale to the banking account at the Bank of England of The Official Trustees of Charitable Funds who shall invest the same in the purchase in their name in trust for the Charity to the credit of a separate account of one or more of the stocks, funds or securities (other than real securities) authorised by law for the investment of trust funds. The said Official Trustees shall invest from time to time the dividends accruing upon the stocks, funds and securities standing to the credit of the said separate account and any cash placed to the same credit at compound interest in the purchase in their name in trust for the Charity to the credit of the said separate account of any stocks, funds or securities of the Government of the United Kingdom or any other securities issued under the authority of Parliament the principal of and the interest on which are for the time being guaranteed by the Treasury and charged upon the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom until dividends and cash equal in amount to the sum expended as aforesaid have been so invested whereupon the said Official Trustees shall transfer all stocks, funds and securities standing to the credit of the said separate account to the credit of a remittance account for the Charity and close the said separate account.

6. *Application of income.*—After the sum expended as aforesaid has been replaced in manner hereinbefore provided the Trustees shall apply the clear yearly income of the Charity in or towards defraying the cost of the maintenance and upkeep of any recreation ground held upon trust for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Parish of Great Faringdon.

7. *Questions under Scheme.*—Any question as to the construction of this Scheme or as to the regularity or the validity of any acts done or about to be done under this Scheme shall be determined conclusively by the Charity Commissioners upon such application made to them for the purpose as they think sufficient.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Land containing 1 acre 2 roods 12 perches or thereabouts having a frontage to Station Road (formerly Butts Road) in the Parish of Great Faringdon numbered 189 on the Ordnance Survey map (1912 edition) used as a recreation ground and comprised in the above-mentioned conveyance dated the 25th June 1901 and made between George Liddiard of the one part and the Chairman and members of the Parish Council of Faringdon of the other part.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Land containing 7 acres 2 roods 24 perches or thereabouts situate at Great Faringdon used as a recreation ground and comprised in an assignment made the 4th August 1948 between Walter Tucker of the one part and the Parish Council of Faringdon of the other part and enrolled in the books of the Charity Commissioners on the 3rd November 1948 pursuant to the provisions of section 6 (2) of the Mortmain and Charitable Uses Act, 1888, and section 1 of the Mortmain and Charitable Uses Act Amendment Act, 1892.
