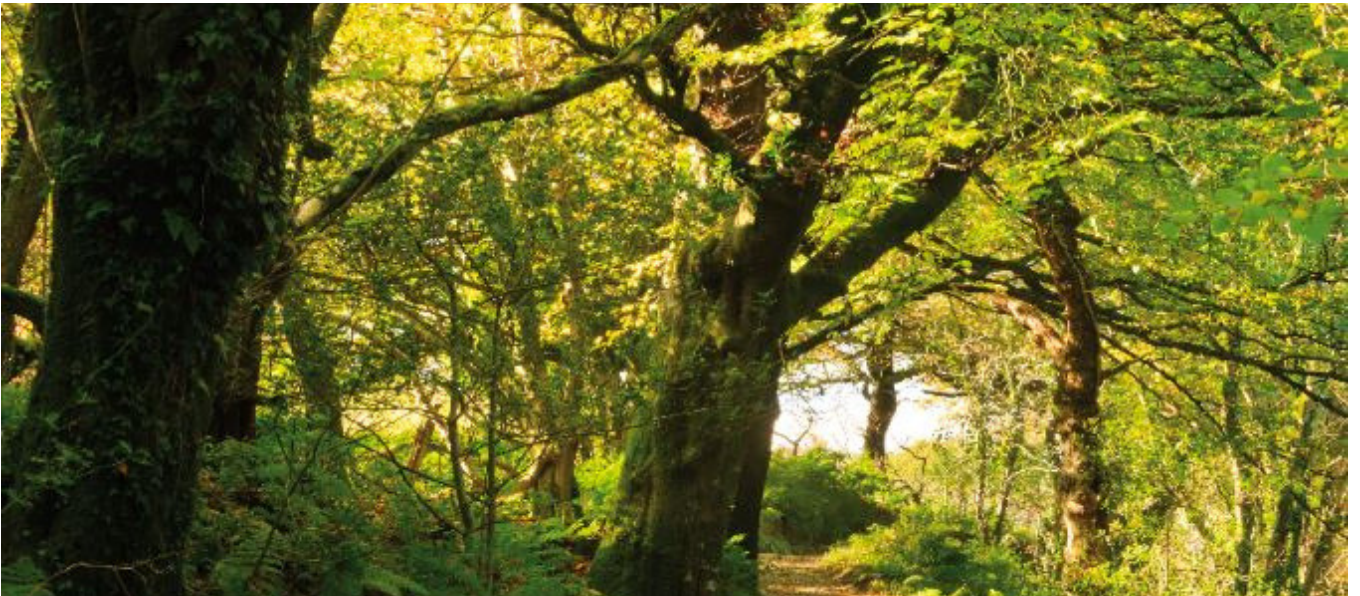

We are a very busy office and are currently working on several projects on top of our normal day-to-day activities, these include: the renovation of the Old Town Hall, working on the installation of a multi-use games area in the Town and the launch of the permanent museum in Faringdon.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you of our Tidy Team activities. One day a week our Leisure Services Team are available to do tidying at the request of you – our residents. Please let us know if there is a public area that needs attention and if we can tidy it, we will! If we can't, we will report it to the appropriate body. We work in partnership with lots of groups and try to help groups to provide activities and events. On a cycling note, I would also like to thank Farcycles for their work to get the Cycle Training Park installed at Folly Park – what a credit to the Town!

A fine example was the Farcycles Music Marathon in the Corn Exchange in aid of the Faringdon Children's Cycle Training Park. This was a spectacle of local musical talent whose virtuosity both amazed and entertained, leaving everyone smiling. The Rotary Club's Dragons' Den event was another occasion that showcased the activities of local organisations in their bids for funding that were gratefully received as due reward.

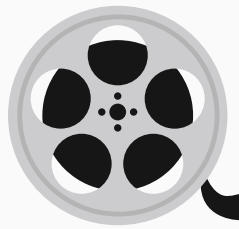
Faringdon Occasional Markets: Young Traders' Market

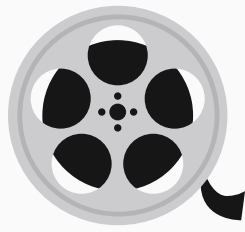

THE UNVEILING OF FARINGDON TAPESTRY

The Faringdon Tapestry is a community project. Started in 2018, the theme of the Tapestry is trade in Faringdon and it showcases the change in trade and commerce throughout history. The project brought together novice stitchers as well as those very skilled in cross-stitch, tapestry and embroidery. Individual pieces were then sewn together to create an impressive wall hanging. The project was funded by Faringdon Town Council and the Vale of White Horse District Council, and sewing supplies were very generously donated by local residents. The Tapestry was unveiled on the 11th July in the Pump House and an afternoon tea was held to thank the community stitchers for all their hard work. This beautiful piece of art was unveiled by Faringdon Town Mayor, Cllr. Dr Mike Wise, and community stitchers Siobhan McElroy and Anna Fletcher. The Faringdon Tapestry is now on display at the entrance to the Faringdon Museum, in the Pump House, for the community to enjoy.

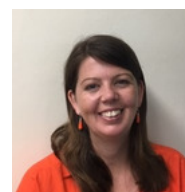
Faringdon Museum is housed in the Pump House and consists of a timeline showing Faringdon's History, information on Faringdon's notable residents, Faringdon at War, with cabinets displaying Faringdon Fossils and much more.

The museum is funded by Faringdon Town Council and Oxfordshire County Council, curated by Faith Carpenter from The Company Curator. Fossils were kindly donated by Oxfordshire Geology Trust and artefacts were loaned to the museum by Simon Hallewell. The museum is both informative and fun, perfect for all ages. Complete with a dressing up box and fossils to touch and hold.
