Planning and Highways Committee Meeting - 24th June

Nine planning applications were considered with no objections.

The following concerns were raised regarding an application for horizontal billboards to the left of the A420 heading North-East:

- 1. Distraction to traffic on the A420
- 2. Not in character for the area
- 3. Longevity of the temporary billboard structures

FTC will carry out a pavement survey in the autumn looking at condition and accessibility. Cllr. Ford volunteered to draw up a map and the town will be split into sections to assess. Any community member who would like to help, please get in touch.

The Clerk has contacted the county council about replacing the older gateway signs and adding new twinning information, Le Mêle-sur-Sarthe and, more recently, Königstein. FTC can contribute funds from earmarked gateway sign funding towards this project.

Community & Partnership Committee - 1st July

A public question raised the need for a Community Centre; an ongoing issue that FTC are exploring possible solutions for.

A Junior Youth Group report showed that it is flourishing! Councillors will be present at FTC's fossil-themed stall at

reflecting on my 22 years at Faringdon Town Council. As I prepare to leave my role on August 30th, 2024, I'm filled with gratitude and pride for all the council have achieved in Faringdon. We have worked together productively and built strong partnerships to deliver countless projects. This includes colleagues, dozens of councillors and five Mayors. I can only remember two challenging partnerships during all my time at FTC. Although FTC only look after very local services, over the years, we have transformed our community in so many meaningful ways.

I wanted to leave you with a few of my favourite highlights of what the council have accomplished during my 10 years as Town Clerk:

Given £000s in grants to local groups, initiatives and festivals. Supporting the vibrant and diverse activities within our community.

Introduced Community Awards, celebrating the incredible contributions of our local heroes.

Founded and managed the Regent Cinema. Bringing the magic of movies to our community.

Faringdon Walks and cycle rides: designed the pink and blue walking routes and installed the Better Ways to School cycling and walking network, using s106 funding.

Brought in-person Citizens Advice surgeries to Faringdon: providing crucial support to our residents.

Founded the German twinning partnership with Konigstein. This included a working visit where we learned so much from our partner town.

A Market Place improvements: benches, including a talking bench, water fountain, artistic tree guard, notice board, planters and artistic bollards.

B The Wilderness: with the dedication of wonderful volunteers transformed wasteland into a thriving habitat.

Saved the Faringdon Children's Centre: now known as The Place, where we sourced funding,

wrote a business plan and managed the project thanks to the commitment of councillors and a wonderful volunteer steering board.

Brought a Community Larder to Faringdon, cutting down on food waste.

🛕 Christmas Lights in the Town Centre

Boules Court: designed and delivered a new community space in an uncared-for corner.

Refurbished the Old Town Hall: preserving our heritage for future generations.

Event Management: delivered memorable events including the Freedom of the Vale Rifles parade, Christmas light switch on, Heritage Day, VE Day beacon, Queen's Jubilee, King's Coronation, outdoor cinemas, and a live Nativity with camels!



Faringdon Museum: conceived and delivered a much-wanted cultural hub. New exhibition coming in August 2024

Office Move to the Pump House: improved operational efficiency with full utilisation and virtual meeting equipment.

S **Improved the Corn Exchange:** sourced funding to deliver new floors and chairs, plus renovation of office space for a permanent home for The Place.

Faringdon Tourist Bus: conceived and delivered a new way for visitors to explore our town.

Successfully lobbied for commercial use in development projects, ensuring balanced development for our community.



Refurbished a vacant shop unit. Partnered with Vale economic development to revitalise a run-down unit using government funding, which now houses Tribe Zero-Waste.
Bench Trail: a creative initiative that organised the town into themed quarters with unique bench designs that will be installed in 2025 using s106 funds.

Supported many local groups and clubs: assisted with grant funding for improvements across various sports and youth organisations.

Foodbank Partnership: working closely with Churches Together brought the foodbank to the town centre and facilitated its expansion during increased demand.



Pandemic Response: introduced virtual meetings, supported the community, led foodbank efforts, and ensured council operations continued smoothly.

Refurbished the Portwell Pump: preserved and enhanced a key historic landmark.

S Secured Over £500,000 in grant funding for various town improvements.

It has been an honour to serve Faringdon and work alongside such dedicated councillors, colleagues, groups, businesses and community members. I truly believe we have made a real difference, and that Faringdon is a

better place to live, work and play due to our efforts. I wish all the very best to my successor, Katherine Doughty (pictured right), who I am confident will serve the town with dedication and expertise.
