

Sally's Summary - Your Town Clerk, Sally Thurston, Summarises recent meetings below. Please see our website for detailed minutes:

Full Council 10th June 2024

The Council **resolved to accept the Faringdon Town Council (FTC) Annual Accounts** and the Town Clerk was congratulated on facilitating an excellent internal audit.

A Planning Application by De Montalt Life Sciences at the former Wicklesham Quarry site for : Outline flexible planning for up to 42,286 sq m GIA of commercial floorspace was supported with the following adjustments that are required to mitigate the impact on the town, including:

- 1. Vehicle access arrangements to the site, specifically:
- Access to the site should include an exit on the existing roundabout to ensure traffic flow is not adversely affected.
- b) All traffic mitigations should be installed before construction work begins.
- 2. Safe crossing arrangements over the A420 and safe access for pedestrians/cyclists to site:
- a) FTC consider a pedestrian and cycle bridge essential to safely cross the A420.
- b) FTC strongly supports the recommendation for a second crossing at Sands Hill.
- 3. Scale of development and its effect on the local landscape:
- Reducing height of building to a maximum of 15 meters would lessen impact on the surrounding landscape.
- b) And buildings without solar panels should have a living roof installed to increase biodiversity.

Members supported an application of restoration work at Sands Hill Quarry, Faringdon.

Members resolved to sell or donate the Lenovo tablets which are no longer used. Any community groups who are interested in the tablets should contact the Town Clerk for more information.

Facilities Committee 17th June 2024

A new working party was nominated for this year's **Christmas Light installations** and approved the purchase of new 'icicle' lights.

Corn Exchange: Members agreed to continue assessing the feasibility of a refurbishment programme, using the quinquennial report to guide the first phase.

Town Park: a quote for an initial design for the refurbishment of the Town Park will be recommended to the Finance and Audit Committee

Telephone Box on Canada Lane: a quote for the refurbishment of the phone box on Canada Lane to include the installation of a defibrillator will be recommended to the Finance and Audit Committee.

Oakwood Park: Members agreed that quotes should be obtained for new equipment and updating current apparatus in Oakwood Park which will include equipment for younger children.

All Saints' Church Bicycle Rack: All Saints' request to install bicycle racks was agreed.

New footpath

FTC have used community
Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding
money to fund a muchimproved pathway at the top of
Canada Lane. This funding
comes to the town council
when a qualifying new
development is built, to make
improvements in or town. FTC
received several requests from



local resident to improve this path, although the path is not owned by FTC it agreed that work was urgent. The once uneven and hazardous pathway for walkers is now much easier to tread. We hope walkers and runners alike can now enjoy a more pleasant experience.



Restoration Work on the Portwell Pump

You may have noticed scaffolding around the Portwell Pump in the town centre. The iconic structure has had a few bumps from buses and lorries in the past so was looking tired and in need of restoration. FTC agreed to use some CIL funding to return the pump to its former glory. The pump was given to the town in the 1590s by Sir Henry Unton, during the



construction of the original Faringdon House. Water was pumped, from under the Pump House, to provide a piped supply to the market place for both animals and humans. It is no longer a pump but is used as a street lamp after electricity was installed in the 1950s. Work will take approximately three weeks and the Portwell should be looking smart in time for Folly Fest on the 12th of July!
