## **Round-Up of Local Issues**

Not all items are covered here, with a selection of the main updates listed below. Please get in touch for further details on these or other items.

- **Flooding on Coxwell Road:** There is a blocked ditch on the north side of road, towards the A420 that is causing flooding. Officers have arranged a site visit with Wain Homes as the situation is more complex than first thought. Awaiting updates.
- **Damaged Wall, Stanford Road:** We are still chasing requests to Sovereign to fix the collapsed wall but had no response as yet; we would appreciate any support the town council may offer in this matter.
- **Preapplication on Folly Sports Park** We believe this imminent and apologise for delays; we are looking into why this has occurred and will report back to you with any feedback.
- Wessex Leisure Funding: We have asked for an update on this funding and awaiting a
  meeting with officers; at the same meeting we will discuss the current the matter of the
  MUGA and acquisition of gym equipment for Faringdon Leisure Centre to ensure S106 funds
  are spent locally whenever possible.
- ATP at Faringdon Community College As reported last month we are awaiting a decision on external funding; we will find out if we are successful next summer.
- Faringdon Infant School Application We submitted comments supporting the development of the new SEND School; it is likely that this decision will go to committee.
- **Boots Pharmacy**: We received an explanation for the closure which has nothing to do with either the district or county councils; Boots procedures have been updated to ensure communication is improved in the future.

# **District Update**

#### Over £720,000 boost for local infrastructure

Over the last six months, the council has transferred over £720,000 to invest in vital infrastructure delivered by the council, town and parish councils and other community organisations. Investments have ranged from new play equipment, wetland habitat creation, art trails and sculptural seating to rugby pitch improvements and toilet refurbishments.

#### **Local Nature Recovery Strategy**

Oxfordshire residents, landowners, businesses, farmers and other organisations are being offered the chance to help shape the priorities for recovering areas of nature and wildlife across the county. Last year, Oxfordshire County Council was <u>named by the government</u> as a responsible authority for driving nature recovery. The council is one of 48 authorities who have been funded by the government to work with local people and organisations to develop a local nature recovery strategy (LNRS). Comments are now being sought on Oxfordshire's draft LNRS as part of a consultation which runs until 26 November 2024. #### **Rethinking Waste**

We're entering a new era for rubbish with the launch of our new joint Waste Resources and Street Cleansing strategy. The new strategy, which was formally approved by Cabinets, puts a strong emphasis on encouraging and enabling people to reduce, reuse, repair, refill and rehome items - instead of throwing them away.
