Town Meeting – 6<sup>th</sup> November 2024

The Mayor, Cllr. Peter Castle,

opened with a speech noting the Council's many accomplishments including:

- Faringdon Town Council (FTC) grants for local organisations, e.g. Follyfest, Folly Tower and the Youth Club.

- New thermal curtains for the Old Town Hall
- Tree planting in Town Park

## Full Council Committee – 11<sup>th</sup> November 2024

Remembrance Sunday and the Remembrance Exhibition in the Old Town Hall: Cllr. Wise reported that there had been a successful Remembrance Sunday event with excellent attendance. The Remembrance exhibition had a good number of visitors over the weekend and was attended by 87 children and their teachers on the Friday!

The last of the County Councillor's fund has been granted to COGS (Community Owned Guidance Service) and to the Folly Tower Trust. The Art Bench Project is progressing with developer funding received and contract signed with the artist Nicola Henshaw. The seven benches each focus on aspects of the town. For example, the benches at Coxwell Road will display geology and the bench for Market Place will depict the underground tunnels/history. The benches will make a wonderful artistic addition to the town as well as providing much needed seating.
