FARINGDON JUNIOR YOUTH CLUB PROJECT **Job Description – Play Worker / Youth Worker**

The Oxfordshire Play Association (OPA), working in partnership with Faringdon Town Council has been running a Junior Youth Club in Faringdon for a few years, we are looking to recruit an additional member of staff to work at these sessions.

The project is designed for Children and Young People in School Years 6 and 7 (Ages 10 to 12) and will look to support them through the transition from Primary School to Secondary School.

Faringdon Junior Youth Club is delivered at All Saints Church in the Autumn / Winter and Faringdon Cricket Club in the Spring / Summer on a Tuesday evening from 6pm to 8pm. The sessions last for 2 hours and are delivered weekly, we are looking for staff to work for 5 hours per week (including prep, delivery, monitoring etc).

The project will provide fun and positive Play opportunities within a Safe and Supportive environment in Faringdon. This project will increase Childrens opportunities to Play and meet in a Safe Space whilst promoting Positive Activities and Behaviours, Increased Levels of Physical Activity and Healthy Lifestyles.

The Oxfordshire Play Association is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (Registered Charity Number 1160320) and has been delivering a Countywide service across Oxfordshire since 1974.

Our Vision is to 'Improve Lives Through Play'

Our Mission Statement is to 'Champion and support the rights of all Children and Young People to have access to high quality, inclusive, Play opportunities to promote their physical, mental and spiritual wellbeing'

The role will involve;

- Planning and delivering weekly, 2 hour sessions offering a range of varied, engaging and Playful activities.
- Creating a setting and environment that promotes Play, Physical Activity, Healthy Lifestyles and Positive Behaviours.
- Working in partnership with Faringdon Town Council and other Community and local Partner Organisations to ensure that we are meeting the needs of the local Community.

- Promoting other services and activities available locally to those accessing the sessions.

Our new Play / Youth worker will work 5 hours per week (2 hours prep, 2 hours direct delivery and 1 hours monitoring and reporting) at an hourly rate of £12.68 per hour (£14.21 per hour including Holiday Pay)

As this job involves working with Children and Young People it will be subject to an enhanced DBS / CRB check, satisfactory receipt of 2 references and completion of relevant Safeguarding Children and Young People Training.
