# Town Council Meeting – 9<sup>th</sup> December 2024 Fair Access Faringdon

Members received a presentation from a local resident on accessibility issues in the town the key objectives of which are:

- Positively to support businesses, organisations and events to provide reasonable adjustments that improve accessibility for disabled members of our community.
- To increase participation of disabled members of our community to ensure they can make a full contribution to the life of the town, including an economic contribution by improving access to retail and hospitality outlets.
- 3. To increase awareness of the barriers to participation in the town over the year and across all sectors.

Members thanked the resident for their very helpful presentation and discussed the issues raised, agreeing to support its aims and objectives. In the first instance, the resident will conduct an accessibility survey of the town centre and will report back to the Town Council in early 2025. Members also agreed to add the consideration of accessibility to the agendas of all committees as something to consider when making decisions. The issues raised by the presentation were also agreed to be fed into the current pavement survey being undertaken by Councillors.

Community facilites at Folly Sports Park - As part of our ongoing efforts to improve community facilities in Faringdon, we are reaching out to local clubs to understand their needs and how we can support them in the future. ## Planning & Highways Committee Meeting – 25<sup>th</sup> November 2024

Marlborough Gardens - The Town Council has received correspondence from residents concerned about speeding vehicles in Marlborough Gardens. The Councillors resolved to organise a vehicle survey to capture data to inform appropriate actions such as installation of a Speed Indicator Device.

Neighbourhood Equipped Area for Play (NEAP) - The Planning Committee considered application P24/V2177/NM - Land South of Park Road - Minor amendments to P21/V0984/RM to vary the equipment proposed within the NEAP. The committee felt that the amended play equipment scheme for the new development was inferior to the scheme previously approved and objected to the application. It is pleasing to note that the District Council Planning Department have since rejected the application.

#### Consultations

An informal consultation for new parking schemes for central Faringdon were unveiled at the recent Town Meeting. Thereafter, the Council will consider feedback and make amendments before Oxfordshire County Council undertake a formal consultation.

Canada Lane (Faringdon) proposed parking restrictions & traffic calming - To extend the existing 'No Waiting at Any Time' (double yellow lines) parking restrictions on the southern side of Canada Lane and a 'build-out' feature on the southern side of Canada Lane adjacent to 'Devon House.' **Countywide proposed Traffic Restriction ANPR Camera Enforcement** – Oxfordshire County Council is seeking your views on the proposal to install 'Automatic Number Plate Recognition' (ANPR) cameras at various locations across the County to help enforce the current restrictions in place. One of the twenty locations proposed is the Market Place (bus lane), Faringdon - No Motor Vehicles - Except buses, taxis, and HGVs for loading. Under the proposed enforcement, motorists who contravene the restriction may be subject to a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) payable at a rate of £70, discounted to £35 if paid within 21 days. An appeals process is in place for motorists who believe a PCN has been issued unfairly.
